OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

Investment Objective

The Sub-Fund's investment objective is to provide long term capital appreciation by investing at least 51% of its total assets in equities of issuers which have their registered office or a preponderant part of their business activities (meaning not less than 51%) in Turkey including state economic enterprises and which are listed on Istanbul Stock Exchange.

Investment Policy

The total amount of fixed income securities issued by Turkish republic, Turkish Government Treasury, public/local authorities or Turkish companies as well as Eurobonds may vary between 0 and 49% of the portfolio.

The Sub-Fund may invest a maximum of 49% of its total assets in money market instruments and liquid assets.

The Sub-Fund may invest in transferable securities issued by the Republic of Turkey via public offerings by Turkish Treasury Undersecretaries or Central Bank of Turkish Republic.

Investment Horizon

Recommendation: this Sub-Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 3 to 5 years.

Income

All income received by the Share Class may be distributed upon the Board's decision.

The Sub-Fund may, in accordance with the investment restrictions of the Fund, invest in financial derivative products for efficient portfolio management and/or hedging purpose.

Sub-Fund and Share Class Currency

The reference currency of the Sub-Fund is EUR and the currency of the share class is EUR.

Subscription and Redemption

Investors may subscribe, convert and redeem shares on demand on a daily basis, by 13:00 Luxembourg time.

The risk and reward indicator illustrates where the Sub-Fund is positioned in terms of its possible risks relative to its potential rewards. The higher the Sub-Fund's position on this scale, the greater the possible reward, but also the greater risk of losing money. This risk indicator is calculated using historical data, which cannot be used as a prediction for the future. Therefore the risk classification may change over time. Even if the Sub-Fund is in the lowest risk class you can lose money, as no investments are entirely risk free.

The Fund is subject to a high level of risk being linked to typical risks of securities markets, such as the macro-economic trends at global level, the level of inflation and interest rates, the evolution of corporate income, the issuers' stability and currency fluctuations. At this time, the level of the risk and reward profile is equal to 7.

Not all risks affecting the Sub-Fund are adequately captured by the synthetic risk indicator. The following risks may affect the Sub-Fund:

Credit risk - is the possibility that a bond issuer will fail to pay interest and principal in a timely manner.

Liquidity risk - investments that could have a lower level of liquidity due to (extreme) market conditions or issuer-specific

factors and / or large redemptions of shareholders of the Fund that could result in a potential decrease of the value of certain of the Fund's investments.

Counterparty risk - the possibility that the counterparty, such as brokers, clearing houses and other agents be unable to perform its obligations due to insolvency, bankruptcy or other causes.

Operational risk - due to issues such as natural disasters, technical problems and fraud.

Currency risk - this exists when the Sub-Fund invests in assets denominated in a different currency. A devaluation of the asset's currency relative to the currency of the Sub-Fund will lead to a reduction in the value of the Sub-Fund.

Derivative risk - the Fund may use derivatives as described in the above section - Investment Policy. Use of derivatives results in higher chances of loss due to the use of leverage, or borrowing. Derivatives allow investors to earn large returns from small movements in the underlying asset's price. However, investors could lose large amounts if the price of the underlying moves against them significantly.

Emerging markets risk - In emerging markets the legal, judicial and regulatory frameworks are still developing so there could be, for local market participants and their counterparties, a high degree of uncertainty.


